



2009 Pinot Noir, Bishop Creek Vineyard

The Bishop Creek Vineyard was planted in 1988 in the Yamhill - Carlton District's coarsely grained, ancient Marine Sediments. These well-draining, warm soils produce wines of contrast to the volcanic clays of the Dundee and Eola Amity Hills. The wines tend to be broader, with darker fruit and silky tannins. Dark and stormy, this intense old vine Pommard is no exception... 35% New French Oak, this is a selection of all three barrels produced, including a new Cadus Voges and a second fill Taransaud Puncheon.
