



2013 Pinot Noir, Sojourner Vineyard, Eola-Amity Hills

On the southern end of the Eola-Amity Hills, facing west towards the coast range sits the Sojourner Vineyard. At 650 feet in elevation, the site overlooks the valley and surrounding vineyards. After over 30 years with Eola Springs Vineyard, Denny found the Sojourner property and developed it into an incredible 16 acre vineyard, planted to three clones of Pinot Noir: Dijon 115, Pommard and Wadenswill. The soils are rocky, volcanic clay with lots of round stones littered throughout.

The Sojourner Pinot Noir is a brilliant juxtaposition between power and elegance. With only 1.4 tons selected from our block in 2013, only the best grapes went into this wine. It is laden with wild berries, earth spices of cinnamon and cayenne and dried roses. A beautiful wine that will age well for years to come.

The clones are Dijon 115, Pommard and Wadenswill, all co-fermented to give a complete portrait of the vineyard site. Fermentation is done with ambient yeasts and then aged for 15 months in barrel, all French oak with 40% new oak in the final blend.
